Project Idea 1: A book a day keeps boredom away!

Short description: The activities in this kit focus on literature. Students will be introduced to classic or modern literature and will participate in collaborative creative activities which will enable them to grow emotionally and socially. Students will work in mixed nationality groups to discuss, interpret and comment on various books and work together on creative activities.

Ages: 9-19

Project Idea 2: Rainbow Village” build your village

Sort description: The earth has been utterly destroyed. Some survivors take on a mission: to create their own fictitious world with its own cultural identity through common laws, a flag, an anthem and the election of their mayor. Through this global simulation, pupils interact in order to introduce themselves, describe their environment, organise their village and prepare a major party in a task-centred approach.

Ages: 10-15

Project Idea 3: How Did We Get Here? Stories of Migration

Short description: Pupils come into contact with this theme at home, on the radio and television and among their friends. Regrettably, coverage of this theme is often based on misunderstanding, misinformation, sometimes deliberate, and a lack of the facts. It is not always easy for teachers to dispel these myths and it is hoped that this project will provide a useful supplement to certain subject areas such as the teaching of history, social studies and citizenship. The project involves inviting a network of classes from as many schools as is practical to study together the migration of people who have left their birth place and have travelled to other parts of their own country or abroad for a multitude of different reasons to gain a better understand the reasons for emigration/immigration and their impact on society.

Ages: 11-15
